

VALUES CARD GAME INSTRUCTIONS



The Values Card Game is a game to play with family and friends.

Game Plan: Players work together to guess each other's values from most important to least important.

SET UP

- Shuffle your cards first
- Give the first player the whiteboard and marker
- Deal 5 cards from the top of the pile to the first player and place them face up

HOW TO PLAY

Everyone looks at the cards. The player secretly chooses the most important value to the least important value of their 5 cards. Write the answers on the whiteboard in order from 1 to 5. Be honest. Don't let anyone see your answers.

The other players discuss what they think the order of your cards will be. The original player cannot speak or give hints while the family is discussing the order.

Once everyone has agreed on the order of values, compare how the answers match.

SCORING

Every correctly ranked card is a point for all the players. (A card is correctly ranked when it matches the rank on the whiteboard.) The better you know your family member, the faster you win the game.

Your family wins the game when you have spelled out the words VALUES GAME.

After each turn, put the cards that you didn't guess correctly in the discard pile. If you run out of cards before the game is over, shuffle the discard pile and keep playing.

The game aims to help you discover what each family member values most.
